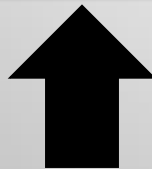

# House Bill 588 - Top 10% Rule

- Rank in the Top 10% of your class.
- Must graduate Foundation with Endorsement-Distinguished Level of Achievement
- Enroll in college no more than 2 years after graduating from high school.
- Complete application process to a Texas public university before application deadline.
- The 2009 Legislative Session granted UT Austin permission to raise the admission standard to admit students in the top 7% of their graduating class.

# Graduating with Honors

**Honor Graduates** shall be determined after completion of the first semester of the senior year to include any student with the following cumulative grade point averages:

- Summa Cum Laude: 6.0-5.0
- Magna Cum Laude: 4.99-4.75
- Cum Laude: 4.74-4.5

# Post Secondary Planning

By the year 2022...60-70% of jobs in Houston will require training beyond high school

Options	Description / Anticipated Length of Study
On the job training	Specific training offered by an employer, includes military service; less than 6 months
Vocational or Technical Certificate	Gain additional entry level job skills; offered at many comprehensive high schools; 1 – 3 years
Private Trade School	Specific skill training after high school for a particular occupation; 3 months – 2 years
Associate's Degree	Offered at junior & community colleges; increase employment options with certifications; 2 years
Bachelor's Degree	Formal course of study ; significant increase in employment options with completion of an undergraduate curriculum; 4 years
Master's Degree	Advanced degree – may be required to pursue certain careers; 1 – 2 years beyond bachelor's
Doctoral or Professional Degree	Advanced degree – may be required to pursue certain careers; 3 – 5 years beyond bachelor's

- Develop resume; prepare visual and performing arts or sports portfolio if needed
- Begin the search for scholarship opportunities

# College Visit Policy

Per CCISD district policy, students may have two college visits in their junior year and two college visits in their senior year, *with two week prior approval from their Assistant Principal and a letter from the college verifying attendance on the campus.* Absences for pre-approved college visits do not affect spring final exam exemptions.

# Tests for College-Bound Students

## TSI *Texas Success Initiative*

- Standardized exam designed to assess college readiness for entering freshman-level students in the areas of mathematics, reading, and writing; must be completed before a student can earn any hours for coursework
- Some students may be able to exempt the **TSI** with certain scores on other standardized exams, such as the SAT or ACT

**Shot Record:** A meningitis vaccination or booster is required if you are younger than 22. Visit [www.sanjac.edu/meningitis](http://www.sanjac.edu/meningitis) for information.

**Transcripts:** Send official high school and/or other college/university transcripts. Emailed transcripts are not accepted.

**Placement Test:** Visit [www.sanjac.edu/testing](http://www.sanjac.edu/testing) to see a list of testing exemptions and learn about exams you may be required to take.
