**THE CLEAR CREEK INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT** is home to explorers and adventurers. Nestled along the NASA Johnson Space Center in Houston and the boating waters of the Gulf of Mexico, Clear Creek ISD proudly serves the educational growth of more than 44,000 students and continues to be one of the most desirable places to raise a family in the Greater Houston area. Out of approximately 1,000 school districts in Texas, Clear Creek ISD is one of the 30 largest. Our district spans 103 square miles, 13 municipalities, and two counties (Harris and Galveston). CCISD students outperform their state-wide peers on all Texas standardized tests and college readiness indicators. Clear Creek ISD is comprised of 27 elementary, 10 intermediate, and 7 high schools. We pride ourselves on involving our stakeholders in making curriculum, finance, and policy decisions, and all of our decisions are made with the best interest of children in mind.

**CLEAR VIEW HIGH SCHOOL** is a school of choice for CCISD. It is a district charter high school designed to meet the needs of the at-risk student and the student in need of a smaller, more structured learning environment. Clear View has a maximum enrollment of 250 students. At the beginning of the year, the population was comprised of, 25 freshmen, 27 sophomores, 38 juniors, and 47 seniors. The population of the school will continue to grow throughout the year, as more students apply to come to the campus. The average graduating class is comprised of approximately 45 seniors. The student body is composed of students from all parts of the United States and foreign countries. Our ethnic diversity is 54% Caucasian, 1% Asian, 31% Hispanic, 9% African American, 1% other ethnicities, and 4% multiple ethnicities. Thirty-six percent of the student body is economically disadvantaged. CVHS, a previous Title I school, rests in the heart of Webster, Texas, a small suburban city located two miles from NASA's Johnson Space Center and 7.6 miles from Ellington Air Field. Major contributors to the local economy are the petrochemical industry, tourism, military, medical professionals, and the many businesses which serve a diverse suburban population.

**CCISD CURRICULUM** consists of over 300 courses for students to choose from to prepare themselves for a variety of post-secondary opportunities. Courses are offered at both regular and advanced levels. Students may take Dual Credit coursework at San Jacinto Community College South. Advanced Academic, Pre-Advanced Placement, and Advanced Placement course are advanced levels which provide students with more concentrated study in a particular field and received weighted points on our G.P.A. scale. CCISD's completion rate is 96.9% and more than 96% of all high school graduates attend college, join the military or enter the workforce.

Colleges, Universities, Armed Services, and Vocational Programs are encouraged to send representatives to our campus. Appointments may be made by calling 281-284-1540. All representatives must check in with the school receptionist for a visitor's pass.

#### RANK IN CLASS

Each semester course has a designated grade point level (GPA Level) used to determine rank in class and grade point average on a **weighted 5.0 scale** (EIC Local). Courses designated as Level 1 courses include Advanced Academic (Adv Acad), Pre-advanced Placement (Pre -AP), Advanced Placement (AP), and Gifted and Talented (GT) courses. Level 2 courses included all general education courses. Level 3 courses are modified in content by the Special Education ARD committee.



#### Spring 2020 Semester Grades and Transcript Information

Due to the emergency closure of the Clear Creek Independent School District resulting from the imminent public health threat of the COVID-19 pandemic, CCISD transitioned from in-person instruction to distance learning from March 16, 2020 through the end of the 2019-2020 school year. As a result of the emergency closure, for the Spring of 2020, CCISD adopted a Pass/Fail grading system in which students were able to earn credit for courses taken and passed during the Spring semester; only "Pass" or "Fail" grades were recorded on academic achievement records and grade points were neither awarded nor included in GPA or class rank calculations. This grading system was adopted in order to maintain equity of the overall grading system and to accurately maintain semester grades on the transcript. Starting in August 2020, CCISD returned to the previously approved grading guidelines as established by district policy (see grading scale).
